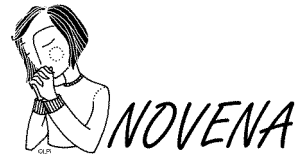

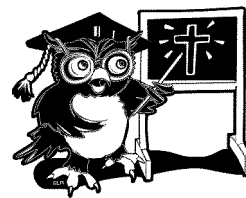

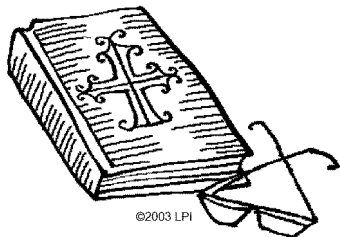
### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:

Sister M. Juvenal Mukamurama of the Benebikira Sisters, a recipient of the *Courage of Conscience Award* by the Peace Abbey. Sister will be here to give a talk about surviving the 1994 Rwanda genocide. Her story is one of faith, truth, courage, peace and unity. During the 1994 genocide the Benebikira Sisters, at great risk to themselves, sheltered hundreds of orphans and others who sought refuge in their convents. Today the Benebikira has about 380 women religious, whose primary mission is education. In their schools they teach unity and peace. Today you will find no longer Hutu and Tutsi; they are Rwandans.
