THE NOVENA OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL: is prayed every Tuesday following the 9 a.m. Mass.

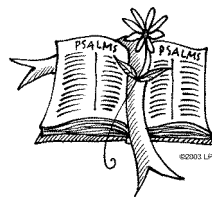
OUR NEW PASCHAL CANDLE: lit at the Easter Vigil is in memory of Lillian & John Laurendeau from their children.
