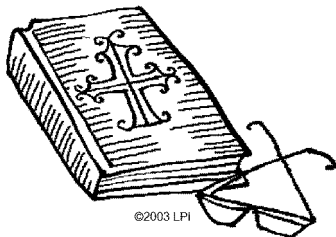

 **The white baskets at the church exits are for items to be sent to our troops in Iraq & Afghanistan. Sheets are available for suggested items.

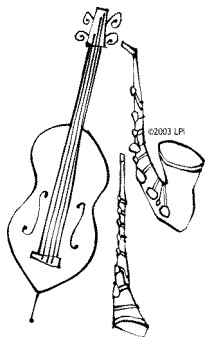

A Shift in Focus: Many researchers are finding that adult stem cells, once thought to be too restrictive, are proving to be a better choice than embryonic stem cells. Corpus Christi: The most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

Corpus Christi focuses on the institution of the Eucharist at The Last Supper that Jesus shared with his disciples on the Thursday prior to His crucifixion. From that time forward whenever a valid Mass is offered, bread & wine are changed into the Body & Blood of Christ. This "transubstantiation" occurs when the priest says the words: "This is my Body.... This is my Blood", as commanded by Jesus at the Last Supper. The bread & wine are truly & irrevocably changed at that time. Jesus becomes present, Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity-upon the altar. He offers Himself as spiritual food to the faithful. Jesus remains present in the Eucharist under the appearance of the bread.
